
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BERKSHIRE COUNTY PROJECTIONS

PREVIOUS PROJECTIONS

In 2015, the Berkshire Regional Planning Commission released the "Berkshire Public School Enrollment Trends" report, which reviewed current enrollment trends in the county and projected future enrollment to 2025 based on births and year-to-year grade changes. Updates to the 2015 projections were done in 2018 and 2020. In 2020, the pandemic hit the Berkshires and disrupted public school enrollment. Many children were taken out of school to be homeschooled or sent to private schools. In addition, many people, including second homeowners, relocated to the Berkshires. This resulted in the 2020 projections being out of date immediately. The new V2024 projections, which run from 2025 – 2035, incorporate several more years of births and enrollment trend data.



The enrollment data shows that from 2020 to 2024, the county lost over 800 students, with a steep decline in 2021 and more moderate declines in 2022 and 2023. In 2024, the decline was only one student.


The birth data also shows an increase in births in the county in 2020 and 2021, countering decades of declining births in the region; however, the general trend is still one of decline. The 2022 data is available for the county but not the municipalities, so the 2024 projections do not use the 2022 birth data. This newest data shows 862 births in Berkshire County in 2022, the lowest level in decades, and a significant decline of 110 births since 2021.

COUNTY PROJECTIONS

Student movement between grades impacts short-term projections; however, births significantly impact long-term projections. With continued declines in births and increased migration, the new projections show a continued decline in enrollment, but not as significant as projected in 2020. By 2035, the projections indicate Berkshire County will have a K-12 Public School Enrollment of 11,397, which is 2,547 less than the 2024 enrollment, a decline of 18%. These projections do not include pre-K or post-12 Special Education enrollment for the districts.

Based on existing 5-year trends, these projections are only projections and should not be assumed to be perfect. As with any projection, the further out from the baseline (2024), the higher the chance of error. Any changes locally, regionally, or nationally to birth rates, migration rates, and even the economy can cause these

projections to be incorrect. In addition, international immigration into the region could significantly impact school enrollment.

SCHOOL DISTRICT ENROLLMENT PROJECTIONS

In reviewing the 2024 actual enrollment to the V2020 projections, while the county numbers are 477 students off, primarily due to the impact of the pandemic, the individual school districts varied widely from the V2020 projections, primarily due to changes in migration into and out of the district.

The new K-12 projections (V2024) take into account changes in births, migration, and choice to neighboring districts. Overall, most of the mid to large districts will see a decline in enrollment. Exceptions include Central Berkshire RSD, Hoosac Valley RSD, and Lenox SD, which see stabilization to minor growth. In addition, the non-traditional districts, Northern Berkshire Vocational and Berkshire Arts and Technology Charter, will see a stable enrollment. It is important to note that the projections for the small school districts have a large margin of error and a change of one or two students can significantly impact the projections. For these small school districts, the projections vary widely, and they should expect a more stable population than projected.


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Berkshire Arts & Technology Charter School

Based on the projections, the Berkshire Arts & Technology Charter School shows an increase in yearly enrollment. However, BART has a state enrollment cap of 363, so it is unlikely to increase as much as projected. In addition, most of its students come from North Adams and Pittsfield. As their projected enrollment declines, it adds doubt to BART's ability to add additional students.

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Berkshire Hills Regional School District


In 2024, the Berkshire Hills Regional School District had 1,121 students enrolled in K-12. While it has gained 11 students since 2023, the trend over the last decade is to lose an average of 21 students yearly. The district appears to lose students entering 1st and 10th-12th grades while gaining in other grades. The number of births, while increasing slightly in the last two years, continues to decline. The projections show that the district will lose 154 students between 2024 and 2035. The projected enrollment amounts to a 14% decline in enrollment.

Central Berkshire Regional School District


The Central Berkshire Regional School District is projected to gain 148 students between 2024 and 2035. This increase is due to a stable/increasing number of births over the last eight years, as well as seeing a significant number of students move into the area between birth and kindergarten. The district also continues to see an increase in students moving into and using choice throughout all grades from K – 9. In high school the district tends to lose students to vocational schools, charter schools, and students dropping out of school.

Clarksburg School District



Farmington River Regional School District



Florida School District


The Florida School District grew between 2018 and 2022 but has since declined to pre-pandemic levels. It will stabilize between 70 and 80 students in K-8.

Hancock School District



Hoosac Valley Regional School District





Lenox School District






The North Adams School District will continue to see a significant decline in its enrollment over the coming decade. This decline is due to several factors. The number of births occurring to North Adams parents has declined significantly over the last few decades. On top of the birth decline, the district loses almost a guarter of all students between birth and kindergarten. The district then loses 20% of students entering 6th grade, likely due to them attending BART. The district loses a further guarter of its enrollment entering 9th grade due to students attending McCann Technical. As a result of these three major departure grades, the district loses 47% of all students who were born in North Adams




Northern Berkshire Vocational School District

Pittsfield School District


The Pittsfield School District is projected to continue to lose enrollment over the coming decade. The number of births to Pittsfield residents has dropped by 20% in the last decade. In addition, the district loses almost 26% of its potential enrollment between birth and kindergarten. Additionally, the district loses another 16% before 6th grade, when students begin going to BART or to other districts via choice. The one grade that shows an increase in students is 9th grade, which is likely due to the vocational programming that is offered at Taconic High School. All other grades see an average of 2.8% loss per year.

Richmond School District







This decline will slow to an average of 13 students per year for the next decade. A large portion of this decline is due to reduced births within the district towns.
